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June BOTM - Churn Dash

It may be quite some time ago, but I still vividly remember cutting out the cereal box cardboard templates for the orange Churn Dash pillow I gave my mom one Christmas. It was on her couch for years before it finally just disintegrated.

No cereal box templates with these directions though. And pretty quick to put together.

For a little bit of a change up, I am offering two sizes for you to sew just to add some interest to the final project.



Materials

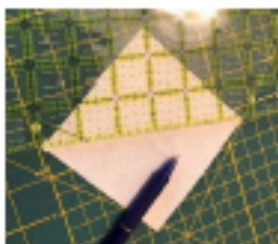
For 9 ½ " block [unfinished]

- White 1 – 3 ½" centre square
- 2 – 4" squares for half square triangles
- 4 – 2" x 3 ½" rectangles
- Pink Print [think azalea, gerbera and bougainvillea bright]
- 2 – 4" squares for half square triangles
- 4 – 2" x 3 ½" rectangles

For 12 ½ " block [unfinished]

- White 1 – 4 ½" centre square
- 2 – 5" squares for half square triangles
- 4 – 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles
- Pink Print [again, think azalea, gerbera and bougainvillea bright]
- 2 – 5" squares for half square triangles
- 4 – 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles

Instructions



1. For the half square triangles, use a ruler and pencil or frixion pen to mark a line corner to corner across the two larger white squares.
2. Place a white square right sides together with a printed pink square.
